

## Guidelines for poster presentation

### Technical Specifications:

- **Poster Dimensions:** The recommended poster size is the standard **A0 format** (841 x 1189 mm), displayed in vertical orientation (Portrait).
- **Legibility:** All text, tables, and graphs must be clearly readable from a distance of at least 1 to 2 meters. It is highly recommended to use standard, clean fonts (e.g., Arial, Calibri) with a minimum font size of 24pt for the body text and 48pt for headings.

**Content Structure:** The poster should be visually appealing, concise, and structured to include the following key sections:

1. **Title:** Identical to the title of the accepted abstract, clearly stating the authors' names and institutional affiliations.
2. **Introduction:** A brief overview of the research problem, theoretical background, and a clearly stated objective of the study.
3. **Methods:** A summary of the participant sample, instruments used, testing protocols, and statistical analysis methods (preferably presented using diagrams or tables).
4. **Results:** Findings should be presented predominantly through high-quality graphs, tables, or charts, with minimal accompanying text highlighting the key findings.
5. **Discussion & Conclusion:** A brief interpretation of the results, their practical applications in science and practice, and the main conclusion of the study.
6. **References:** List only the most essential references directly related to the study (maximum 3 to 5 references).

### Poster Presentation Session:

- Authors are required to bring their printed posters to the conference venue.
- All necessary materials for mounting the posters onto the designated display panels will be provided by the conference organizers.
- During the official poster session (as scheduled in the conference program), at least one of the authors must be present next to their poster to present the work and answer questions from the scientific committee and attendees.
